INTERIOR - HOME

SEVERAL ARTIFACTS ARE SITTING ON A TABLE. MAN ENTERS. HE WALKS AROUND THE TABLE PONDERING. HE TAKES A DEEP BREATH, THEN PICKS UP A FEW ITEMS AND HEADS TOWARD THE DOOR. HE SUDDENLY STOPS, LOOKS AT ONE OF THE ITEMS, THEN QUICKLY RETURNS THEM TO THE TABLE. HE IS VISIBLY STRUGGLING WITH A DECISION.

(FRUSTRATED) The disciples asked me to sell all I have. (Holding an item) Such possessions are rare and very expensive. *(TROUBLED)* So how can Peter make this request of me?

(THINKING BACK) I remember when I first met Peter. He was walking with Jesus on the coasts of Judaea beyond Jordan. Great multitudes of people constantly followed Jesus wherever he went. Many were sick or crippled, and Jesus healed them all. I was not one that needed anything since I had many possessions and good health but I followed also. I followed because Jesus taught the scriptures like no other. He taught about the blessings of God and the Kingdom of Heaven. His words and His wisdom could only be inspired by God Jehovah.

On one particular day I pressed through the crowd toward Jesus. When I finally reached him I said, "Good Master, what good thing must I do to have eternal life?" I was surprised at Jesus' reply. He said, "Why do you call me Good? There is none good but One and that is God." A million other thoughts raced through my mind...*(SLOW)* as Jesus waited for my answer. *(DISTRAUGHT)* But I had none. So with a heavy heart, I turned and walked away from Jesus.

(RECOVERING) It was just several weeks ago when I saw Jesus again....
